

Enamul Hoque President and CEO Hoque & Asssociates

Hoque and Associates, Inc. (HA) is a consulting engineering firm located in Phoenix, Arizona, specializing in geotechnical exploration and engineering, civil engineering, construction materials testing, environmental assessment and solid waste engineering. HA provides high quality, innovative, cost-effective and responsive services to public sector clients including city, county, state and federal agencies and private sector clients including architectural and engineering firms, contractors, materials suppliers, real estate developers and property owners.

Hoque & Associates was founded on February 7, 1997, at which time the company was named Hoque, Peters & Associates. The company was founded with two other minor partners. On March 31, 1998, the partners separated, resulting in the creation of the new company, Hoque & Associates which has been in operation ever since.

Enamul Hoque was born and brought up in a remote village in Bangladesh on the bank of the Meghna River in the early 1950s. He was one of six siblings in a community where poverty and desperation were a part of everyday life. While some might view the circumstances of his upbringing as deprived, Enamul views his childhood as a blessing. He learned from both his parents early on the importance of giving back to the community and carries on this tradition at Hoque & Associates, Inc.

Since his childhood, Enamul has been involved in volunteering his time in helping the less fortunate in Bangladesh and later here in the USA. While an undergraduate student pursuing an engineering degree, he was active in the slums of Dhaka city along the old railroad tracks, establishing and maintaining an evening school for the poor and destitute. His active participation in the community led him to work for Mother Teresa's organization. By performing engineering designs for hospitals, women's training centers, and community centers for Mother Teresa's organization, he found himself at the start of a life where community service would be an integral part of his professional life.

HA began in 1997 with less than 5 employees and annual revenue of \$290,000. Since then, HA has grown to 21 employees in 2007 with \$2.1 million in annual revenue last year and expects to exceed the \$2.2 million dollar mark this year. HA is a client of the Arizona Statewide Minority Business Enterprise Center.
